NEWS & OBSERVER TO BRING SPRING FOOD DRIVE TO A CLOSE WITH DRIVE UP DAY Benefits the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina

RALEIGH, NC (April 17, 2012) - The News & Observer's 2012 Feed the Need spring campaign launched on April 1 and will culminate on Saturday, April 21, Feed the Need Day, with on-site drive up food donation sites. The annual food and funds campaign called "Feed the Need" was initiated by the News & Observer in 2007 to benefit the Food Bank of Central & Eastern NC. This major campaign raises food and funds at a time when donations are slow and children who receive free and reduced priced lunches at school will soon be starting summer breaks. In the last five years, Feed the Need has provided over 1.19 million meals to children and their families in the Food Bank's service area. The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina is a nonprofit organization that has provided food for people at risk of hunger in 34 counties in central and eastern North Carolina for 30 years. The Food Bank serves a network of more than 800 partner agencies such as soup kitchens, food pantries, shelters, and programs for children and adults through warehouses in Durham, Greenville, New Bern, Raleigh, the Sandhills (Southern Pines), and Wilmington. In fiscal year 2010-2011, the Food Bank distributed more than 42.75 million pounds of food and non-food essentials through these agencies.
