## LETTER CARRIERS COLLECT MORE THAN 270,000 LBS DURING STAMP OUT HUNGER

Food Bank of Central & Eastern NC Releases Preliminary Total for 34-county service area

RALEIGH, NC - On Saturday May 9, Letter Carriers across the country, performed double duty on their routes – delivered the mail and collected food items during the 23<sup>rd</sup> Annual STAMP OUT HUNGER FOOD DRIVE. The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina is one of the beneficiaries of the annual food drive. Preliminary Stamp Out Hunger totals for the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina's (FBCENC) 34-county service area are 272,892 pounds (equivalent to 229,803 meals). Sweeps of postal branches will take place starting Monday, May 11, with a final total to be available by Friday, May 15. Please contact the Food Bank's media contact for final totals.

The Food Bank serves a network of more than 800 partner agencies such as soup kitchens, food pantries, shelters, and programs for children and adults through distribution centers in Durham, Greenville, New Bern, Raleigh, the Sandhills (Southern Pines), and Wilmington. In fiscal year 2013-2014, the Food Bank distributed more than 53 million pounds of food and non-food essentials through these agencies. Sadly, hunger remains a serious problem in central and eastern North Carolina.
