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FOOD BANK RECOGNIZES FOOD LION AS "FOOD DONOR OF THE YEAR"

Retail Partner receives honor for support of hunger relief

RALEIGH, NC – The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina announced today that Food Lion is the 2010-2011 Food Donor of the Year. The Food Bank is the largest and oldest food bank in the state and quietly ended its 30th year of fighting hunger on June 30. For three decades, support from the community has been critical in allowing the organization to fulfill its mission to harness and supply resources so no one goes hungry. One retail partner in particular, Food Lion, has grown to lead the pack in retail donations including sponsoring Food Lion Hunger Relief Day at the NC State Fair for nearly a decade. The Food Bank recognizes Food Lion for an extraordinary 8.2 million pound commitment to hunger relief.

In fiscal year 2009-2010, the Food Bank distributed more than 41.5 million pounds of food and non-food essentials through these agencies.
