

Food Bank and Triangle Companies Team Up for Sort-A-Rama Event on May 26 to Feed Thousands of Local Families

RALEIGH, N.C., May 16, 2016 – The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina (FBCENC) will collaborate with Triangle companies for the fifth annual Sort-A-Rama event. On this day, up to 1,000 corporate volunteers will unite to sort and package more than 175,000 meals for local families living with food insecurity.

The event will take place on Thursday, May 26 beginning at 9 a.m. at the Jim Graham Building on the North Carolina State Fairgrounds, located at 1025 Blue Ridge Road.

Sort-A-Rama is FBCENC's signature volunteer event that began in 2012. Since then, Sort-A-Rama volunteers have sorted more than 455,000 meals which were distributed to individuals, families, and seniors in need through FBCENC's partner agencies in their 34-county service area.
