LIVE OAK BANK VOLUNTEERS TO HELP STOP SUMMER HUNGER

July 8, 2014 (Wilmington, NC) - Live Oak Bank recently issued a challenge to the Wilmington community – raise \$25,000 for the Stop Summer Hunger Campaign and Live Oak Bank will match that donation to the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina. Thanks to the support of the community, almost half the funds needed for the match have been donated!

The Stop Summer Hunger Campaign kicked off June 1 and ends July 31 – there is still time to help provide an additional 250,000 meals to children and their families this summer.

And on Wednesday, July 9, Live Oak Bank will be doing even more to support kids this summer! Live Oak Bank employees will volunteer at Wilmington Residential Adolescent Achievement Place (W.R.A.A.P.), a long time Food Bank partner that hosts a Kids Summer Meals site. Kids Summer Meals is a program sponsored by the Food Bank that offers children a place to receive not only breakfast and lunch, but enrichment and physical activities as well. The Live Oak Bank volunteers will be serving lunch to the children participating in the program.

In fiscal year 2013-2014, the Wilmington Branch distributed the equivalent of 5.5 million meals to those struggling with hunger in Brunswick, Columbus, New Hanover, and Pender Counties.

WHEN: Wednesday, July 9, 2014, 10:45 a.m.

WHY: Since 1980, the Food Bank has been providing food assistance to families in 34 counties of central and eastern NC. In the four counties served by the Food Bank at Wilmington, nearly 68,000 individuals are at risk of hunger. For every dollar donated the Food Bank is able to distribute \$10 worth of food or 5 meals.
