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Food Bank CENC Receives Donation from the Walmart Foundation to Purchase Vital Equipment; Expand FNS Program

RALEIGH, NC – The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina received a \$60,000 grant through the Walmart Foundation's State Giving Program for the purchase of transportation and operations equipment including a truck motor for the Greenville Branch and electric pallet jacks for Durham and Raleigh. The new equipment will increase the Food Bank's efficiency when delivering donated food to the branch areas and to our partner agencies across the service area.

A portion of the funding from the Walmart Foundation will also support the Three Squares for CENC program, which aids people at risk of hunger in the community, including low income seniors, veterans, and working families with children, by providing FNS/SNAP program information and application assistance. The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, also known as Food and Nutrition Services or FNS in North Carolina) is a reliable source of food support for people facing hard times. Three Squares dedicated outreach coordinators connect eligible families with food benefits in times of need to free up limited household income for other necessities, such as rent, utilities, and medicine—keeping people in their homes and the entire community stable.

"The funds provided have allowed the Food Bank to strengthen our infrastructure which ultimately allows us to distribute more food to those in need."
